Quarantine has meant that our family of 28 kids (Veksy and Jeffry are still in Tegucigalpa, largely because travel is almost impossible) have not left our property in months as schools and church are closed. This has given us time to get healthy, spend more time reading and playing together, and studying God's Word. We have had many big celebrations, birthdays, Easter, and more. Best of all, we celebrated Dorla, age 13, giving her life to the Lord!

We have been so blessed by our volunteer nannies! They have gone above and beyond the call of duty! Two have stayed in quarantine with us! In general, we are only minimal staff. This has been quite challenging at times!

Perhaps the greatest challenge has been trying to home school my crew. We have been very grateful for technology during this time. We are also grateful for the staff and teachers of our local schools who have made learning from home possible.

I have been so happy to have extra time to organize and clean. The blessing of our new appliances and my birthday gift of living room furniture has made our home more cozy. We have been so blessed to be able to deliver some food bags and give away some extra food and supplies to some of our program families and neighbors.

All of that is done under all bio-safety precautions. Workers who leave the campus daily shower when entering, wear masks and wash hands often. We have a hand washing station set up at the gate. People step into a pan of bleach to clean there shoes soles as the enter. Any cars or motorcycles entering have their tires sprayed with bleach and water upon entry. Kolby and I shower directly when coming from town.



All in all, God has shown Himself great in the midst of the storm. All our love and prayers for you and your families! We love and miss you!
